More about our topic...

Our main topic for the spring term will be Blue Planet.

We will be learning about where the world's oceans and seas are, as well as looking further into what an ocean is and the different layers they are made up of. Children will develop their geographical skills further by locating oceans and seas around the world using a variety of maps and atlases. By the end of this unit, the children will understand the importance of oceans to our planet and the impact humans can have on them.

This is an incredibly fascinating topic, and we aim to make it a memorable one! Through cross-curricular learning we will partake in some exciting activities. Make sure you continue to keep an eye on our class web pages to see the fantastic learning taking place!

Science

In Science this term, we will be initially looking at Living Things and their Habitats. The children will explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things. In the second half-term, we will move onto 'Magnets'. We will be learning about how magnets attract or repel each other as well as investigating if materials are magnetic.

English

Our class text for the spring term will be The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. It tells the story of the Pevensie children - Peter, Susan, Edmund and Lucy - who step through a wardrobe door and find themselves in the land of Narnia. Frozen in eternal winter, Narnia is a land of snow and pine forests, and its creatures are enslaved by the terrible White Witch.

Reading for pleasure and enjoyment will lie at the heart of our English curriculum. Children have enjoyed spending time in our new library and voting in class each week for which book they would like to read. In guided reading, the children will use and engage with a wide range of texts linked to our topic. They will take part in group discussions and will be encouraged to share their own views and reading interests. Through discussion and questioning, comprehension skills will be developed. This will enable the children to gain an increased understanding and appreciation of literature.

Children will have the opportunity to find out more about a new poetry style this term. In their writing, they will be progressing their skills by writing explanation texts and studying a chosen author in more depth.

Opportunities within all areas of the curriculum will be made available for children to develop their spoken language through discussion, drama, and presentations.

Maths - Maths will be taught as an individual subject and will continue to adhere to the curriculum objectives. Teaching will enable children to become fluent in arithmetic as well as being able to reason and problem solve. Our Maths lessons in the Spring term will focus on Multiplication and Division. This will be followed by Fractions and Decimals. Pupils will be extended at every opportunity to ensure their potential as mathematicians is achieved.

PE – Moles will be swimming every Monday with PE also on a Tuesday

Squirrels – Monday and Tuesday

Badgers – Wednesday and Thursday
