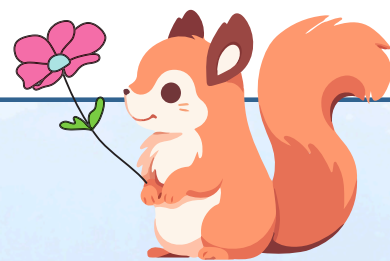
Staffing update

Maths

November has been a fun and busy month in Maths! Our primary students have been working hard, learning new skills, and enjoying lots of hands-on activities. Children continued to practise important number work, including addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. We focused on understanding number patterns and using different strategies to solve problems with confidence.

This month, classes learned about exciting new areas of Maths, such as:

Shapes and Space: identifying 2D and 3D shapes, exploring symmetry, and describing shape properties

Measurements: using rulers and measuring tools to compare lengths, heights, and weights

Data Handling: creating simple charts and talking about information in tables and pictograms

These topics helped students make real-life connections in fun and practical ways. Children enjoyed maths games, group challenges, and problem-solving activities that encouraged teamwork and creativity. Many students showed excellent enthusiasm and perseverance—well done, everyone!

Music

The sound of music is filling the corridors as music lessons are being conducted and celebrated throughout school. There are children learning musical instruments with Rory from Pop Rox. Following the new Arbor Parent Portal launch, if you have any problems with setting up the app please contact the School Office so that we can help you.

If you wish to log your child's absence using Arbor, please click the menu button located on the bottom left corner of the screen, select attendance, then click the green 'log absence' button and complete the details.

Although all communication is now sent through Arbor, some messages will pop up in the parent portal and some will be in your email inbox so please keep an eye on both. This is mainly due to not being able to add attachments to the in-app messages. Our IT support have updated our security setting so all emails should now go to your email inbox rather than your junk mail.

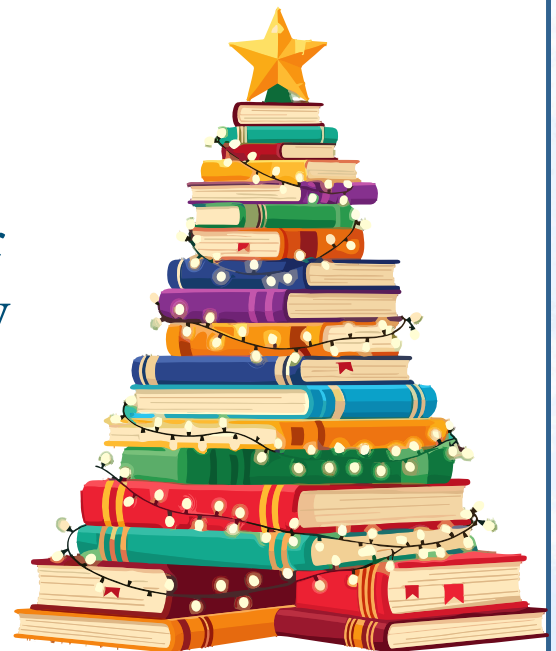
Wet play boxes
