

## PE and Sport Premium for Primary Schools 2020-2021

At Donington Cowley Endowed Primary School we are committed to providing and developing a range of quality PE and Sports opportunities for our pupils.

Our Primary School PE and Sports funding will help us to build on and to extend our provision and to continue to promote healthy and active lifestyles for our children.

Each primary school has been allocated £16,000 plus £10 per pupil as part of this exciting initiative. The anticipated funding for our school is approximately £18,250. Schools are able to choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire special P.E. teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during P.E. lessons
- support and involve the least active children by running in-school after after-school clubs
- provide resources and training courses in P.E. and support for teachers
- run sporting competitions and increase pupils' participation in the School Games (<u>https://www.gov.uk/government/policies/getting-more-people-playing-sport/supporting-pages/the-school-games</u>)
- run sporting competitions with other schools
